


### 7. Unauthorized Pet Areas

a. Pets are prohibited from entry into any offices, playgrounds, exchange outlets, dining facilities, snack bars, theaters, clubs , schools, hospital or dental facilities, commissaries, and other public facilities to include exterior deck or covered areas .

## Prohibited Items

The following items are prohibited and may not be brought to school for any reason:

- Toys of any kind unless permitted by a teacher for a special project

Any such items in evidence at school will be confiscated. Appropriate disciplinary actions will be taken.

## FLU VACCINE RISKS

A vaccine, like any medication can result in an allergic reaction. The risk of serious harm, or death, is very low.

### Nasal Spray

Reports from patients 2– 17 years old describing mild problems include; runny nose, congestion, cough, fever, headaches, muscle aches, wheezing, abdominal pain, occasional vomiting and diarrhea.

Reports from patients 18– 49 years old describing mild problems include; runny nose, congestion, sore throat, cough, chills, tiredness, weakness and headache.

### Flu Shot

Mild problems that occurred after receiving the shot, usually began right after the shot was given and last for 1-2 days. Symptoms include soreness, redness, swelling at injection site, fever or aches.

### Severe Reactions

Life threatening allergic reactions are extremely rare. If a severe reaction occurs, it will be within the first few minutes after receiving the vaccine. Signs of a severe reaction can include difficulty breathing, hoarseness, wheezing, hives, paleness, weakness, a fast heart beat or dizziness.

***If a severe reaction occurs, seek medical attention immediately.***

## FLU FACTS

An annual flu vaccine is recommended because the Influenza Viruses change each year.

It takes up to 2 weeks after the vaccination for protection to develop, but you are protected the entire year!

You can get the vaccine as soon as it is available, and for as long as illness is occurring in the area.

Flu season lasts from November to May, but peaks in January or February— sometimes later in Europe.

The Flu vaccine can be given at the same time as other vaccines, including the Pneumococcal vaccine.

# Why Get Vaccinated?

The “FLU” is a contagious disease.

It is caused by the Influenza Virus, which can be spread by coughing, sneezing or nasal secretions.

The “FLU” can cause:

Fever, Sore Throat, Chills,

The “FLU” can make some people much more sick than others. It can lead to pneumonia and can cause complications for people with heart conditions. It can cause a high fever, diarrhea and seizures in children. In a typical year, approximately 5 to 20 percent of the population gets the seasonal flu and approximately 36,000 flu-related deaths are reported.

**THE FLU VACCINE CAN PREVENT THE FLU!!**



## Nasal Spray

This vaccine contains live, but weakened Influenza Virus.

0.1 mls is sprayed into each nostril.  
It is approved for ages 2-49 years of age.

**You should NOT receive this version of the vaccine if you:**

Are older than 49 yrs or younger than 2 yrs.

Have chronic health problems (ie. Heart or lung disease, kidney or liver disease, blood disorders, asthma or diabetes).



## Flu Shot

This vaccine is an inactivated (killed) version of the Influenza Virus.

It is given via injection into the arm.

It can be given to all ages beginning at 6 months old.

**You should NOT receive the**

**Flu Vaccine if:**

You have SEVERE egg allergy.

You have had an allergic reaction to a previous dose of the Flu Vaccine.

You are moderately or severely ill. (please wait until you recover to get your flu shot)

You have ever had Guillain-Barre' Syndrome.

**(if any of these apply to you, be sure to consult your provider)**

**It is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED that the following people get the Flu Vaccine:**

All children 6 months to 18 yrs old.

Adults age 50 and over.

Those with chronic medical conditions.

Health Care workers

Teachers

Day Care providers
