We have FLUZONE (shots), Flumist (nasal); and Pediatric FLUZONE (shots for the 6m-2y/o).

Red Ribbon Week is fast approaching. We will celebrate being drug free October 25 – 29<sup>th</sup>. This year's national theme is "I Am Drug Free." The Annual Poster, Writing, and Coloring Contests have been announced. NES theme of the year is NES "Rocks" Drug Free. There will be a separate theme for each day of the week and children are encouraged to show their participation by dressing according to the theme. Please follow the schools dress code when planning your attire.

## Dress Code

We ask your cooperation in assuring that your child is clothed properly, with discretion, in keeping with weather conditions and in harmony with community expectations.

The following items are prohibited at Naples Elementary School:

- Spaghetti straps or tops with less than 2 inch wide straps
- Clothing which promotes tobacco, alcohol, or drugs, sex, etc.
- Backless/strapless tops or dresses, bare midriffs
- Shorts or mini skirts that are shorter than the arm length of the student
- Clothing with holes or rips
- Hats, head bands, bandanas or any type of head covering
- Mesh or see-through blouses, shirts, skirts or shorts
- Bare feet, shower flip flops, roller skate shoes, heeies
- Chains, safety pins, spiked clothing, spiked necklaces, or bracelets

\*Students will follow normal rotation for specials for the week so please be sure if your child has P.E. That they dress accordingly.
